District Goals for Student Achievement

All students are at grade level and making growth in these areas:

- Pre-Kindergarteners on target in reading
- 3rd graders at grade level in reading and math
- 5th graders at grade level in reading, math and science

Decrease the gaps between student groups in:

- Grade-level learning, measured by MCAs
- Identification for Talent Development and Acceleration Services
- Referral to Special Education
- Absences
- Suspensions

School Goals

Reading:

The percent of student scoring proficient or higher in reading will increase from 19% to 38 % by Spring 2017 as measured by the MCA.

Math:

The percent of students scoring proficient or higher in math will increase from 20% to 39% by Spring 2017 as measured by the MCA.

Equity:

The percent of students who have had five or more out of classroom referrals in 2015-16 school year will decrease in 2016-17 year by 10% as measured by SWIS data.

In the Fifth Grade Classroom

The fifth grade team will work with students and their families to support students' academic success. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- An IB Programme of Inquiry brochure will be sent home at the beginning of each of the 6 IB units
- Fifth Grade will host an IB Exhibition event inviting the community to school to explore one of our IB units
- Fifth grade will work on reading comprehension and understanding different genres and text types
- *Thinking Blocks* will be used to practice real world math application problems
- Provide access to student projects based on the 6 Units of Inquiry

At Home

Benjamin E. Mays IB World School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' academic success.

Families may have other ideas to add to this list:

- Attend the IB Exhibition event and look for the IB Programme of Inquiry brochures
- Make sure my student has enjoyable books to read
- Ask my child about what they read.
 - What is the main idea?
 - Supporting details?
- Encourage my child to question as they read
 - Make predictions about what will happen next
- Work with my child on math homework Monday through Thursday
- Visit the library
- Initial Reading Calendar
- Look for the *Weekly Highlights* email
